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

School report cards have historically been designed with policymakers in mind—they weren't:

- readily shared with parents and guardians
- designed in a way that families could understand or get valuable information about a school



By December 2018, OSSE must produce ONE report card for ALL schools



Inform Parents

Shape Better Policy

Propel School Improvement

Families at all income levels will use the system and reports to inform their school choices and/or engage more deeply with their current school

Clear information will help families determine the best fit school for their children, and illuminate schools in all sectors who are succeeding at serving children System leaders will use the reports to **make better policy and resource choices** and facilitate conversations across LEAs and the city about education These reports will create a common language used across and within the education sectors

School leaders and educators will use the information in the system to inform their thinking and planning, and **share what is working**





A Balancing Act ...

Our **primary audience** for the report card is **parents and families** and we will prioritize their needs, but we know other groups will use it and need to be engaged

We must **balance needs of users** of the information and the **effort required of schools** to produce it

Some data points are required by law or by the accountability framework which we can't exclude from the report card

We need to launch in 2018 but this isn't a one-time effort, we will continue to refine the look and feel and metrics over time



A school report card is an informational tool that should provide you with information that you'd like to know about a school overall, and help you understand how well a school is doing or where it needs more support. Right now, families get thier information from many places like word of mouth and websites like Learn DC and My Schools DC, or even from schools directly. Having so many options can be confusing but by December 2018, OSSE has to produce ONE report card for ALL schools (district and charter), in ONE place, to make it easier for parents to access information. Report cards aren't just for parents and families.

They can also prompt conversations between educators about what is working across the city as well.

The report card is mandated by a law called the Every Student Succeeds Act or ESSA. But, even though it's mandated, DC is taking the opportunity to build the best, most useful report card it can for families. OSSE has launched a city-wide public engagement effort to hear from families and the community about what they would want to know about schools so we can build a report card that is useful, accessible, and easy to navigate.
