 - Schools often are on a 3-year rotation, so Miner may not host again for a few more years




"Special" Curriculum

- As part of the "Vision" process started in the 2015-2016 school year, Miner stakeholders were asked if they were interested in bringing a "special" curriculum to Miner something that would help differentiate Miner and attract families
- The majority of respondents felt this was a "great" idea
- When asked which specific programs were of interest, all options were rated generally the same (~50% rated these options as "great")
- Options presented were:
 - Dual Language/Language Immersion, Museum-Arts Integration, STEM/STEAM, and International Baccalaureate


Survey Results - General "Special" Curriculum




Survey Results -Dual-Language/Language Immersion




Survey Results - Museum/Arts Integration

"Special" Curriculum

- Over the course of the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 school years, DCPS representatives from these various disciplines have held meetings and forums with parents to discuss these programs in more detail, and to solicit parent feedback
- Over time, three options became favored:
 - Dual Language/Language Immersion
 - STEM/STEAM
 - International Baccalaureate
- These options are not necessarily stand-alone, and it may be possible to have multiple programs at the same time
- Principal Jackson and the LSAT agreed to ask DCPS to hold another parent forum to discuss these three options
- It is hoped to have this forum soon so that parent feedback can be used in the development of next year's school budget
