- E/BFSC is one of five neighborhood-based Collaboratives in the District of Columbia, which make up the city-wide Healthy Families, Thriving Communities Collaborative network.
- E/BFSC opened its first Family Support Center in Brookland Manor in 1997 and began formally serving families. In 2011, E/BFSC expanded its geographic target area and now provides services to all communities in Ward 5 and Ward 6.
- One of the six original grantees to receive funding from OSSE to implement Full Service Community School Programs at Amidon-Bowen Elementary and Jefferson Middle School Academy



# What is a Community School?

As defined by the Community Schools Incentive Act of 2012, a "community school" is a public and private partnership to coordinate educational, developmental, family, health, and after-school-care programs during school and non-schools hours for students, families, and local communities at the public school or public charter school with the objectives of improving academic achievement, reducing absenteeism, building stronger relationships between students, parents, and communities, and improving the skills, capacity, and well-being of the surrounding community residents.



# FY19 Miner Elementary Eligible Services

- (1) School-aged child-care services include before-school and after-school services and full-day programming that operates during school holidays, summers, vacations, and weekends;
- (2) Mental health prevention and treatment services that will be available to students and community residents;
- (3) Programs designed to facilitate parental involvement in, and engagement with, their children's education, including parental activities that involve supporting, monitoring, and advocating for their children's education; and programs designed to promote parental leadership in the life of the school and build parenting skills;
- (4)Primary medical/dental care that will be available to students and community residents;

- Lead applicant and responsible for managing grant requirements; as set forth by OSSE
  - Mid-Year Program Reports

  - Fiscal Responsibility
  - End of Year Site Visit

# **Community School Coordinator**

#### Role and Responsibilities:

- Facilitate effective implementation and maintenance of the community school
- Securing and maintaining the community partnerships integration of the eligible services and partner programs
- Ensure students and families are participating in those services; in partnership with school leaders
- Stationed on-site at Miner full-time to become enmeshed in school culture and climate – seen as an member of the school community
- Is a member of the school leadership team to support the advancement of the Community School model; and eligible services

#### **PTO Grants**

#### Classroom Grants - Available NOW

- Must be used for direct classroom or instructional use. Teachers, staff, or grade levels can pool their grants into a single request for funding
- Teachers/staff may claim their grant either by having the PTO directly purchase the requested items or through reimbursement if the teacher/staff wishes to make the up-front purchase the items themselves
- The PTO will process only one purchase or reimbursement per teacher/staff per school year. If a teacher wishes to be reimbursed, they may submit as many online reimbursement requests with receipts as they like, but the PTO will write a reimbursement check for them only when the total value of reimbursement requests reaches the funding maximum (or the cutoff date passes)
- All requests must be submitted by May 1, 2019

#### **PTO Grants**

#### Field Trip Grants - Available 2019

- Reassessing budget in January to determine amount available
- Grades 1-5: each grade has a single allocation (not per teacher) so homerooms will go on field trips together
- Kindergarten and ECE classes can each use their grant as a grade level or individually (as a whole grade level is preferred but not required due to the number of classrooms)

#### Clubs/Sports/Extracurricular Activities - Available NOW

- \$500 for first semester (\$300 remaining)
- \$1,000 for second semester
- All requests must go through Mr. Jackson first
- All requests must be submitted by May 1, 2019
