Meeting Minutes

The meeting came to order at 6:07pm. The following members of the Executive Board were present: Julie Muir, Jamie Milhous, Ms. Tarren Cummings, Principal Bruce Jackson.

Opening Remarks:

- Thank you to Christ City Church for providing babysitting and food in room 103.
- The next meeting will be on January 7 at 6:00pm.
- The minutes from the November 2019 meeting were posted to the website approximately 2 weeks ago. A motion to approve the minutes without reading them aloud was made and seconded. The motion passed unanimously and the November 2019 minutes were approved.

Principal's Report - Mr. Jackson:

- K-5 Attendance Wars is underway! Students must arrive on time and be present for roll call. The class with the best attendance will win a pizza party. ECE will have their own treat but without the competition since Head Start regulations regarding attendance are different than DCPS K-5 requirements).
- Picture day is 12/12. Please send the form back by 12/11 so admin can be sure to get the pictures you request (with or without Santa).
- Spirit Week is 12/16-20. Students will have fun themed dress days including pajama day. An announcement will be made soon so your student knows how to dress.
- OSSE Report Cards released
 - Miner star rating dropped from 3 to 2
 - o Disappointing but not unexpected
 - o Increase/neutral in social/emotional scores
 - Net gain of less than 1 in proficiency on PARCC
 - o Loss in academic growth category, especially compared to previous year
 - Changes this year to improve
 - Changes in 3rd 5th grades, starting with overall master schedule
 - Re-vamped student support system for struggling students
 - Informal observations in classrooms makes admin very optimistic going forward
 - More than ½ of 3rd 5th grade team is new this year
 - Emphasis on academic vocabulary, helped by the addition of science and social studies teachers
 - Most points on the star rating come from growth and proficiency
 - What messaging can we as parents do? Promote our successes: student retention is good, family ratings of Miner are stronger than in the past
 - Star rating is a fair assessment in that we didn't improve test scores like we should have, but at the same time it doesn't factor in important things like our community school initiative, our Kindred partnership, the start of an Equity Team, etc.

LSAT Report:

- Next meeting 12/17 at 5pm
- New parent member LaToya McCarthy-Scott elected to increase racial diversity and to add an upper-grade parent
- LSAT plans to add 1-2 community members, including someone from the Eliot-Hine community
- Enrollment projection for next year: 390. For Sy19-20 projection was 372 and our current enrollment is 386.

PreK Parent Committee Report:

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Garden Team/FoodCorps Report:

- Discovery Garden in ECE playground includes native pollinator plants, paw paw trees, outdoor classroom space, storage bins, a sink, and instructional signage. Thanks go to AWS and DOEE!

- DDOT planted some trees around the property

- OSSE reimbursement check of over \$7,000 was deposited today so balance will be much higher tomorrow
